

NICENE CREED

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

A middle-aged woman sat on the couch in my parish office and recounted to me a shocking list of terrible calamities in her life: addictions, terminal illnesses, financial loss, broken relationships, and so on. She smiled as she did so. "Please forgive me," I asked, "but you seem to be smiling as you share this." She said, "Father John, I am totally overwhelmed. But I'm smiling because I just can't wait to see what good things God does with this mess." She expected God would manifest His glory when she most needed it.

This week in the Gospel, God speaks from heaven for the third and final time in Jesus' earthly ministry. It's at a tough moment. Gentiles seek Jesus, who announces his terrible suffering, and then boldly prays, "Father, glorify your name!" John then writes: Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it and will glorify it again." Was the task of drawing the whole non-Jewish world to himself overwhelming? Or was it the terrible specter of crucifixion? Whatever it was, the crushing weight triggers his turning to the Father with an unshakeable expectation of divine glory to burst through. And indeed, it did on Easter Sunday. In our burdens, our greatest strength is to turn to God and boldly ask Him for His glory.

Lenten challenge: This week, I invite you to list out everything which is a burden to you. Write it down. Then add these words: "Father, glorify Your name in all these things!" Put that paper in your pocket or purse when you come to Holy Week liturgies next week. You might smile at the most unlikely times.




Whoever serves me must follow me, says the Lord; and where I am, there also will my servant be.





St. Joseph, the Husband of Mary



March 19th is the feast of St. Joseph, the Husband of Mary. Not much information is available about Joseph in sacred scripture. There is not a single word of his recorded. He is described as a "righteous man" and was unwilling to submit Mary to shame. We know that in every instance recorded in scripture, when Joseph received divine revelation through a dream, he did not hesitate to follow those instructions. While we know very little about St. Joseph, the fact that he was chosen to be the husband, the guardian, and the protecter of Mary, the immaculate and perfect tabernacle of the only begotten Son of God ... well, if we knew only that

and nothing else, it would be enough to reverence and honor God's choice of Joseph as the foster father of Jesus and husband of Mary. Today, let us pray for all fathers; those who with their wife decide to adopt an older child, or a child with disabilities; those who with their wife choose to foster children who are so in need of stability and love. And finally, let us pray for those unmarried men, who when confronted with an unexpected pregnancy, make the often difficult choice to love, support and care for their child and the mother of that child. 



SAN ANTONIO HISTORY



Many have asked what is the meaning of the stained glass window above the altar, and why is it so modern and stylized?

First, it is important to realize that after Vatican II, the church recommended that windows above the altar should never be so mesmerizing that they draw more attention to the window during Mass than what is taking place on the altar. Therefore the designer of our window at San Antonio chose to do a stylized depiction of Jesus' resurrection into heaven. The following is the explanation that was given to our very first parishioners. Notice that the window is divided into nine sections. If you look closely at the top right section you can see five pieces of white glass that are shaped like the upward extended hand of Jesus. Next, notice the inverted U-shape design between the upper left and upper middle piece. This is meant to be the head of Jesus as he ascends. All the swirling different colored glass pieces (done in colors to co-ordinate with the décor of the rest of the church) are meant to be the clouds that began to cover the figure of Jesus as He ascended into heaven.

Holy Thursday Visitation of Seven Churches




Join us in Adoration in Glynn Hall, after the 7 PM Holy Thursday Mass (March 28, 2024). Adoration will continue until 6 AM Friday morning; bring friends and family to visit six other participating churches.

The Diocese of Orange will be hosting the 3rd Annual Holy Thursday "Visitation of Seven Churches" tradition. Last year over 35+

parishes/community centers around our diocese participated and hundreds of faithful drove around the diocese to visit and spend time with the Lord.

Why we do this: Each visit calls on the faithful to reflect on the seven final places Jesus went from his arrest on Holy Thursday to his death on Good Friday. At each church, pilgrims kneel before the altar of repose, meditate on a scriptural excerpt, and offer prayers and adoration. The Seven Churches Visitation (or Pilgrimage) is credited as beginning in Rome with St. Philip Neri in the 1500s. Neri would lead groups of faithful to visit each of the seven basilicas of Rome on Holy Thursday night as a way of keeping watch with Christ as though at the Garden of Gethsemane before his passion.




