



### **NICENE CREED**

## Sunday Readings

### Reading 1

1 SM 3:3b-10, 19

Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the LORD where the ark of God was. The LORD called to Samuel, who answered, "Here I am." Samuel ran to Eli and said, "Here I am. You called me." "I did not call you, "Eli said. "Go back to sleep." So he went back to sleep. Again the LORD called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli. "Here I am, " he said. "You called me." 



### ANOINTING OF THE SICK


On the first Tuesday of the month, after the weekday 8:30am Mass, presiding clergy will provide the Anointing of the Sick for those who stay after Mass.



This exhibition, which was designed by Blessed Carlo Acutis, features a wide range of images and historical summaries of the various Eucharist miracles that occurred across the world and were acknowledged by the Catholic Church.

He died of leukemia in 2006 and was beatified in 2020.
